**Sources of Variation in Foreign Exchange Reserves in India  
during April-June 2019**

Earlier today, the Reserve Bank of India released [balance of payments \(BoP\) data for April-June 2019](#) on its website ([www.rbi.org.in](http://www.rbi.org.in)). On the basis of these data, the sources of variation in foreign exchange reserves during April-June 2019 have been compiled.

**Sources of Variation in Foreign Exchange Reserves: April-June 2019**

During April-June 2019, there was an increase in the foreign exchange reserves. The sources of variation in the foreign exchange reserves are set out in Table 1.

**Note:** 'Other items in capital account' apart from 'Errors and Omissions' include SDR allocation, leads and lags in exports, funds held abroad, advances received pending issue of shares under FDI, capital receipts not included elsewhere and 'rupee denominated debt'.

On a balance of payments basis (*i.e.*, excluding valuation effects), the foreign exchange reserves increased by US\$ 14.0 billion during April-June 2019 as against a decrease of US\$ 11.3 billion during April-June 2018. The foreign exchange reserves in nominal terms (including valuation effects) increased by US\$ 17.0 billion during April-June 2019 as against a decrease of US\$ 18.8 billion in the corresponding period of the preceding year (Table 2).

The valuation gain, mainly reflecting the depreciation of the US dollar against major currencies, amounted to US\$ 3.0 billion during April-June 2019 as against a loss of US\$ 7.5 billion in April-June 2018.
