INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

In construing the conditions, the specifications, Schedule of Quantities and Articles of Agreement, the following words shall have the meanings herein assigned to them except where the subject or context otherwise requires.

- a) "Employer" shall mean the Reserve Bank of India and shall include its assigns and successors.
- b) "Bank's Engineer": shall mean the Engineer of the Employer who is in - charge of the "Works".
- c) "Contractor" in the case of a partnership: "Contractor" shall mean ----- and -- -----trading as partners in the name and style of ----- and having a place of business at ----- and shall include the partners for the time being of the said firm and the legal representatives of a deceased partner.
- C1) In the case of individual: "Contractor" shall mean Shri/ Smt.----- Trading in the name and style of ----- and shall include his/ her heirs, successors and legal representative.
- C2) In the case of company: "Contractor" shall mean ----- a company incorporated under -----and having its registered office at ----- and shall include its successors and assigns.
- d) "Site" shall mean the site of the contract works including any building and erections thereon and any other land (inclusively) as aforesaid allotted by the Employer for the Contractor's use.
- e) "This Contract" shall mean the Articles of Agreement, Instructions & conditions, Special conditions, The Appendix, The Schedule of Quantities, drawings/ sketches and specifications etc. attached hereto and duly signed.
- f) "Notice in writing or written notice": shall mean a notice in written, typed or printed characters sent (unless delivered personally or otherwise proved to have been received) by registered post to the last known private or business address or registered office of the addressee and shall be deemed to have been received when in the ordinary course of post, it would have been delivered.
- g) "Act of insolvency": shall mean an Act of Insolvency as defined by the Presidency Towns Insolvency Act, or the Provincial Insolvency Act or any Act amending such original Act.
- h) "Net Prices": if in arriving at the contract amount the contractor shall have added to or deducted from the total of items in the Tender any sum, either as a percentage or otherwise, then the net price of any item in the tender shall be the sum arrived at by adding to or deducting from the actual figure appearing in the Tender as the price of that item as a similar percentage or proportionate sum provided always that in determining the percentage or proportion of the sum so added or deducted by the Contractor the total amount of any Prime Cost items and Provisional sums of money shall be deducted from the total amount of the tender. The expression "net rates" or "net prices" when used with reference to the contract or accounts shall be held to mean rates or prices so arrived at.

“The works”: shall mean “**CONVERSION OF COURTYARD INTO OPEN TEA ROOM**”.
Words imparting persons include the plural and vice versa where the context requires.

Section B

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRCT

1. The Part I and Part II of the Tender shall be uploaded on MSTC website. **The Part I of the tender should contain only covering letter, clarifications, technical and commercial conditions if any, Special conditions and the Part II should contain only Price Bid in the BOQ.**
2. No tender will be received after **2.00 PM on 07/10/2022** under any circumstances whatsoever.
3. Part I tender will be opened at 1600 Hrs. on the same date at the office of **The Principal, College of Agricultural Banking, Reserve Bank of India, University Road, Pune-411016** or any other officer designated for this purpose by him in the presence of the Bidders or their representatives, should they choose to be present. Part II of the tender will be opened on the same day or a subsequent date, which will be intimated to all the Bidders. Tenders shall remain valid for acceptance by the Bank for a period of three months from the date of opening of the **Part II of the tender** which period may be extended by mutual agreement and the Bidder shall not cancel or withdraw the tender during this period.
4. **Earnest Money Deposit (EMD):** The Earnest Money Deposit of **₹14,500/-** shall be payable in the form of NEFT. Documentary proof in respect of remittance of EMD through NEFT should be submitted to the Bank. A tender which is not accompanied by EMD will not be considered. The EMD will be returned to the tenderer if his tender is not accepted by the Bank, without any Interest. The EMD paid by the successful tenderer shall be held by the Bank as security for execution and fulfilment of the contract. No interest shall be paid on this deposit.
5. **Retention Money Deposit (RMD):** 5% of the total value of work done will be withheld from the Bill by the Bank as Retention Money (RM). The Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) of the successful tenderer and the RM shall be converted into Security Deposit (SD). **On receipt of Virtual Completion Certificate issued by the Bank's Engineers, the EMD retained towards security deposit shall be released to the contractors and the Retention Money deducted towards Security deposit shall be released on expiry of the stipulated Defects Liability Period.**
6. The Reserve Bank of India does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves to itself the right to accept or reject any or all the tenders, either in whole or in part.
7. The Reserve Bank of India reserves the right to sub-divide the work mentioned in the tender, amongst two or more contractors at its own discretion and the Contractor will have to execute orders for part of the items placed with them at the quoted rates. The Reserve Bank of India also reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantities and

even omit any item of work after the order is placed and the Contractor shall execute the same. In this context, the rates quoted for each item must be self-supporting and relevant.

8. **Contract Agreement:** On receipt of intimation from the Employer of the acceptance of his/their tender, the successful Bidder shall be bound to sign the formal Contract and within **fourteen days** thereof, the successful Bidder shall sign an agreement in accordance with the draft agreement and the Schedule of Conditions but the written acceptance by the Reserve Bank of India of a tender will constitute a binding contract between the Reserve Bank of India and the person/ firm so tendering, whether such formal agreement is or is not subsequently executed. The cost of necessary Stamp paper for execution of the agreement shall be borne by the successful Bidder.
9. **Assignment and sub-letting:** The Contractor shall not assign the contract. He shall not sublet any portion of the contract except with the written consent of the Employer. In case of breach of these conditions, the Employer may serve a notice in writing on the Contractor rescinding the contract whereupon the security deposit shall stand forfeited to the Employer, without prejudice to his other remedies against the Contractor.
10. The Contractor shall carry out all the work strictly in accordance with details, specifications and instructions of the Bank's Engineer. If in the opinion of the Bank's Engineer, any changes have to be made in the specification the Contractor shall carry out the same. The Bank's Engineer decision in such cases shall be final.
11. A schedule of probable Quantities in respect of each work and Specifications is enclosed. The Schedule of Probable Quantities is liable to alterations as per Bank's requirement. Each tender should contain not only the rates but also the value of each item of work entered in a separate column and all the amounts quoted against various items should be totaled in order to show the aggregate value of the entire tender.
12. The Bidder must obtain for himself on his own responsibility and at his own expenses all the information which may be necessary for the purpose of making tender and for entering into a contract and must examine the drawings, inspect the site of the work, acquaint himself with all local conditions, means of access to the work, nature of the work and all matters pertaining thereto.
13. **Taxes/ levies to be included in the rates:** The rates quoted in the tender shall include all charges for **packing, transport, loading, unloading, delivery at site, hire for any tools and plants etc.** The rates shall also be firm and shall not be subject to exchange variations, labour conditions, fluctuations in railway freights or any conditions whatsoever.

The applicable GST percentage, as per the Govt. of India (GOI) extant rules/regulations, shall be added by the contractor at the end of the tender amount to work out the total tender amount.

14. Prices of extras etc. and ascertainment:

a) The contractor may, when authorized and shall, when directed in writing by the Employer add to, omit from or vary the works shown upon the drawings, or described in the Specification, or included in the Schedule of Quantities, but the Contractor shall make no addition, omission or variation without such authorization or direction. A verbal authority or direction by the Employer shall if, confirmed in writing **within seven days**, be deemed to have been given in writing.

No claim for an extra shall be allowed unless it is executed with the written approval of the Employer. Any such extra is herein referred to as 'Authorized extra' and payment shall be made in accordance with the flowing provisions;

(i) Net rates or prices in the original tender shall determine the valuation of the extra work where such extra work is of similar character and executed under similar conditions as the work priced therein. Rates for all items wherever possible shall be derived out of the rates given in the Priced Schedule of Quantities.

(ii) The net prices of the original tender shall determine the value of the items omitted, provided if omissions vary the conditions under which any remaining items of works are carried out, the prices for the same shall be valued under sub-clause (iii) hereof.

(iii) Where the extra works are not of similar character and/ or executed under similar conditions as aforesaid or where the omissions vary the conditions under which any remaining items of works are carried out or if the amount of any omissions or additions relative to the amount of the whole of the Contract works or to any part thereof shall be such that in the opinion of the Bank's Engineer, the net rate or price contained in the Priced Schedule of Quantities or tender or for any item of the works involves loss or expense beyond that reasonably contemplated by the Contractor or is by reason of such omission or addition rendered unreasonable or inapplicable, the bank's Engineer shall fix such other rate or price as in the circumstances he shall think reasonable and proper.

(iv) Where extra work cannot be properly measured or measured or valued, the Contractor shall be allowed day work prices as the net rates stated in the tender or the Priced Schedule of Quantities if not so stated, then in accordance with the local day work rates and wages for the district provided that in either case vouchers specifying the daily time (and if required by the Employer, the workmen's names) and materials employed be delivered for verification to the Employer or his representative at or before the end of the week following that in which the work has been executed.

(b) It is further clarified that for all such authorized extra items where rates cannot be derived from tender, the contractor shall submit rates supported by rate analysis worked on the 'actual cost basis', plus 15% towards establishment charges, contractor's overheads and profit.

(c) The Contractor should note that unless otherwise stated the tender is strictly on item rate basis and his attention is drawn to the fact that rates for each and every item should be correct, workable and self-supporting. The quantities in the Schedule of Quantities approximately indicate the total extent of work but may vary to any extent and may even be omitted thus altering the aggregate value of the contract. However, during the actual execution of work if the quantities of any of the items of work exceeds by **more than 25 % of the tender quantities**, the quantities of such items executed, by the authority of Bank's Engineer, in excess of 25% of the tender quantity shall be considered as an extra item of work for which the contractors shall submit fresh rates supported by rate analysis worked on the actual cost basis plus **15%** towards establishment charges, contractor's over heads and profit. The rates for all such items of work, being current ones, will not be eligible for price adjustments due to increase or decrease in prices of materials and labour rates as per escalation formula, if any given in the tender. If any of the items of work is omitted from the accepted tender at the sole discretion of the Bank, the contractor shall not be entitled to any claim on this account.

15. **Liquidated damages for delayed completion:** Time allowed for carrying out the work is **45 days** which shall be strictly observed by the Bidder and it shall be reckoned from the **tenth day** of written order to commence the work is issued. The work shall throughout the stipulated period of the contract be proceeded with all due diligence and if the Contractor fails to complete the work within the specified period he shall be liable to pay compensation at the rate of 0.25 % of the accepted contract value per week subject to a maximum amount of **10% of the contract amount**. The Bidder shall before commencing work prepare a detailed work programme, which shall be approved by the Bank's Engineer.
16. The Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation for any loss suffered by him on account of delays in commencing or executing the work, whatever the cause of delays may be, including delays arising out of modifications to the work entrusted to him or in any sub-contract connected therewith or delays in awarding contracts for other trades of the project or in commencement or completion of such works or in procuring government controlled or other building materials or in obtaining water and power connections for construction purpose or for any other reason whatsoever and the Employer shall not be liable for any claim in respect thereof. The Employer does not accept liability for any sum besides the tender amount, subject to such variations as are provided for herein.
17. The successful Bidder is bound to carry out any or all items of work necessary for the completion of the job even though such items are not included in the quantities and rates. The Employer will issue schedule of Instructions in respect of such additional items and their quantities in writing.
18. The successful Bidder must co-operate with other contractor(s) appointed by the Employer so that the work shall proceed smoothly with the least possible delay and to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

19. **Defect Liability Period and Performance Guarantee Period:** Any defect such as peeling off, fading of paint or any other fault which may appear during 12 months Defect Liability Period stated in the Appendix hereto from the date of virtual completion of work in full as specified under the contract, arising in the opinion of the Bank's Engineer from materials or workmanship not in accordance with the contract, shall upon the directions in writing of the Bank's Engineer, and within such reasonable time as shall be specified therein, be amended and made good by the Contractor at his own cost and in case of default the Bank may employ and pay other persons to amend and make good such defects/faults and damages, loss and expenses consequent there upon or incidental thereto shall be made good and borne by the contractor and such damages, loss and expenses shall be recoverable from him by the Bank, or may be deducted by the Bank upon the Bank's Engineers' certificate in writing from any money due or that may become due to the contractor. The contractor shall remain liable under the provisions of this clause notwithstanding the signing by the Bank's Engineer any certificate or passing of any accounts.

20. **Stipulated time for completion of work:** The work must be completed in given time period. The entire work is to be completed within a period of **30 days** from the tenth day of issue of work order. The Contractor is advised to visit the site and get himself fully acquainted with the general and local site conditions, particularly, those having bearing upon transportation, handling, storage etc. prior to quoting the tender.

21. Materials to conform to specifications - Tests on Materials work etc.

i). All materials and workmanship shall, so far as procurable, conform strictly to requirements in accordance with the schedule of quantities and instructions of Bank's Engineers and the contractor shall, upon the request of the Bank's Engineer, furnish proof to his satisfaction that they so conform and if required shall also furnish all invoices, accounts, receipts and other vouchers for this purpose.

ii). However, the contractor shall, before he places orders for supply, furnish to the Bank's Engineer at his own expense, samples of materials including patented products and those under specific makes, proposed to be used in the works, well in time, notwithstanding prior approval by Bank's Engineer/Employer of such products and makes; such prior approval shall not constitute a waiver of the rule regarding approval of samples. In all cases when makers/manufacturers have test certificates for their goods/articles/products/ processes/equipment, Photostat copies of such test certificates shall be produced by the contractor along the samples.

iii). The Bank's Engineer will, within two weeks of the date of supply of samples or within such further period, as it may be depending upon each case, require to intimate to contractor whether the samples are approved by him or not. If samples are not approved, the contractor shall forthwith arrange to supply to the Bank's Engineer for his approval, fresh samples complying with the specifications.

iv). The approved samples, bearing distinct marks of identification of such approval, shall be displayed by the contractor, at his own expense, prominently at the site, during the entire execution period, and for one month after the date of virtual completion of the work, for inspection/verification by the Bank's Engineer/Employer, without any charge accruing to him (contractor) the approved samples remaining in the safe custody of the contractor till they are so handed over to the employer.

v). The Bank's Engineer shall be entitled to have tests carried out on the work or its parts or material accessories, either during its progress or on completion, where and when deemed necessary or on any materials to be incorporated in the work/installation supplied by the contractor or otherwise, notwithstanding that the work or its parts or accessories or the said materials have been accepted and passed/passed for incorporation. The contractor should arrange for such tests at their own cost and no payment shall be made in this regards.

vi). The scope of the clause regarding test will cover not only materials/articles of everyday use and of ordinary description but also patented products and those under specific makes, notwithstanding that satisfactory test certificates from makers/manufacturers have been produced in accordance with sub clause-iii above.

vii). The methods of sampling, the nature and extent of the tests to be carried out and their interpretation shall be in accordance with the provisions of relevant BIS codes unless otherwise provided in this contract. The names of the laboratories or test houses, (where tests are to be done outside the site), in which the tests are to be carried out shall be got approved by the Bank's Engineer.

22. The contractor should quote rates in the Schedule of Quantities considering all the conditions mentioned above and elsewhere in the tender.
23. The successful Bidder may please note that, the Bank will deduct the amount on account of Work Contract tax, education cess and the income tax including surcharge etc., if any, from the bills as per the orders of State / Central Government as applicable during the period of the contract.
24. **Insurances:** The contractor shall be responsible for any injury to persons, animals or things and for all structural and decorative damage to property which may arise from the operation or neglect of himself or of any nominated sub-contractor's employees, whether such injury or damage arise from carelessness, accident or any other case whatever in any way connected with the carrying out of the contract. This clause shall be held to include, inter-alia, any damage to buildings, whether immediately adjacent or otherwise, and any damage to roads, streets, footpaths, bridges or ways as well as all damage caused to the buildings and works forming the subject of this contract, by frost or other inclemency of weather. The contractor shall indemnify the Employer and hold him harmless in respect of all and any expenses arising from any such injury or damage to

persons or property as aforesaid and also in respect of any claim made in respect of injury or damage.

a) Under any Acts of Government or otherwise and also in respect of any award of compensation or damages consequent upon such claims.

b) The contractor shall reinstate all damages of every sort mentioned in this clause, so as to deliver up the whole of the contract works complete and perfect in every respect and so as to make good or otherwise satisfy all claims for damage to the property of third parties.

c) The contractor shall indemnify the Employer against all claims which may be made against the Employer by any member of the public or other **third party** in respect of anything which may arise in respect of the works or in consequence thereof and shall at his own expenses arrange to effect and maintain, until the virtual completion of the contract with an approved office, a policy of insurance in the joint names of the Employer (first name) and the Contractor against such risks and deposit such policy or policies with the Employer from time to time during the currency of this contract. The minimum limit of the coverage under the policy shall be ₹2 lakhs per person for any one accident or occurrence and ₹5 lakhs in respect of damage to property for any one accident or occurrence. The contractor shall also similarly indemnify the Employer against all claims which may be made upon the Employer whether under the **Workmen's Compensation Act** or any other statutes in force during the currency of this contract or at Common Law in respect of any employee of the contractor or any sub-contractor and shall at his own expense effect and maintain, until the virtual completion of the contract, with an approved office a policy of insurance in the joint names of the Employer (first name) and the Contractor against such risks and deposit such policy or policies with the Employer from time to time during the currency of the contract.

d) The Contractor shall be responsible for anything, which may be excluded from the insurance policies above referred to, and also for all other damages to any property arising of and incidental to the negligent or defective carrying out of this contract. He shall also indemnify the Employer in respect of any costs, charges or expenses arising out of claim or proceedings of damage arising there from.

e) The Employer shall be at liberty and is hereby empowered to deduct the amount of any damage, compensation, costs, charges and expenses arising or occurring from or in respect of any such claims or damage from any or all sums due or to become due to the contractor. In addition to the above, the Contractor shall insure the work and take **CAR (Contractors All Risk) policy** against loss due to fire, theft, earthquake etc., for the entire contract amount with an approved insurance company till the virtual completion of the work and deposit the policy or policies with the Employer before commencing the work.

f) In default of the Contractor insuring as provided above, the Employer may so insure and deduct the premiums paid from any money due or which may become due to the Contractor. In case, if for any reason, the Insurance is not taken, by oversight, by the

Employer also and the fact comes to light at a later stage, the Employer shall deduct the premium for the Insurance as assessed by the Employer and the contractor shall accept the same without demur.

g) The contractor shall be responsible for any liability which may not be covered by the insurance policies referred to above and also all other damages to any person, animal or effective carrying out of this contract, whatever may be the reasons due to which the damage shall have been caused.

h) The contractor shall, upon settlement by the insurer of any claim made against the insurer pursuant to a policy taken under this clause, proceed with the diligence to rebuild or repair the work destroyed or damaged. In this event all the money received from the insurer in respect of such damage shall be paid to the contractor and the contractor shall not be entitled to any further payment in respect of the expenditure incurred for rebuilding or repairing of the materials or goods destroyed or damaged.

i) The contractor, in case of rebuilding or reinstatement after fire etc, shall be entitled to such extension of time for completion as the Bank's Engineer may deem fit, but shall however, not be entitled to reimbursement by the Employer or any shortfall or deficiency in the amount finally paid by the Insurer in settlement of any claim arising as set out herein.

j) Without prejudice to his liability under this clause, the contractor shall cause all nominated sub-contractors to effect, for their respective portions of the works, similar policies of Insurance in accordance with provisions of this clause and shall produce or cause to produce to the Employer such policies. The contractor shall not permit a nominated sub-contractor to commence work at the site unless the above said Insurance Policies are submitted. In the event of failure of the sub-contractor to take out such a policy of insurance before commencing the works at the site, the contractor shall be responsible for any claim or damage attributable to the said sub-contractor.

25. If in the opinion of the Bank's Engineer the works be delayed (a) by force majeure or (b) by reason of any exceptionally inclement weather or (c) by reason of proceedings taken or threatened by or dispute with adjoining or neighboring owners or public authorities arising otherwise than through the Contractors own default or (d) by the works or delays of other Contractors or Tradesmen engaged or nominated by the Employer and not referred to in the Schedule of Quantities and/or Specification or (e) by reason of civil commotion, local combination of workmen or strike or lockout affecting any of the building trades or (f) in consequence of the contractor not having received in due time necessary instructions from the Bank's Engineer for which he shall have specifically applied in writing or (g) from other causes which the Bank's Engineer may certify as beyond the control of Contractor or (h) in the event, the value of the work exceed the value of the Priced Schedule of Quantities owing to variation, the Bank's Engineer may with previous approval in writing of the Employer make a fair and reasonable extension of time for completion of the contract works. In case of such strike or lockout the Contractor shall immediately give written notice thereof to the Employer but the Contractor shall

nevertheless constantly use his endeavors to prevent delay and shall do all that may reasonably be required to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer to proceed with work.

26. If the contractor needs an extension of time for the completion of the work or if the completion of work gets delayed for any reasons beyond the due date of completion stipulated in the contract, the contractor shall apply to the Employer for extension of time in writing at least 7 days before the expiry of the scheduled time and while applying for extension of time contractor shall furnish the reasons in detail and his justification, if any, for delays. Only that period of extension of time as granted by the Employer (on receipt of the application from the contractor or even in absence of any such application) will qualify for exemption of imposition of liquidated damages. For the balance period in excess of original stipulated period and authorized extension of time granted by the Employer, the provision of liquidated damages as stated under **Clause 15** will become applicable.

Further the contract shall remain in force even for the period beyond the due date of completion irrespective whether the contractor has applied or not, for the grant of extension of time for completion unless the Employer decides to terminate the contract. The delay for completion of work for any reason will not entail any right to the contractor to claim any revision of rates or any extra compensation for any reason.

27. **(a) Termination of Contract by the Employer:** If the contractor being an individual or a firm commits any "act of insolvency", or shall be adjudged an Insolvent or being an Incorporated Company shall have an order for compulsory winding up made against it or pass an effective resolution for winding up voluntarily or subject to the supervision of the Court and the Official Assignee or the Liquidator in such acts of insolvency or winding up, as the case may be, shall be unable within **seven days** after notice on him requiring him to do so, to show to the reasonable satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer that he is able to carry out and fulfill the contract and to give security therefore, if so required by the Bank's Engineer.

Or if the contractor (whether an individual, firm or incorporated Company) shall suffer execution or other process of Court attaching property to be issued against the contractor.

Or shall suffer any payment under this contract to be attached by or on behalf of any of the creditors of the contractor

Or shall assign or sublet this contract without the consent in writing of the Employer first hand and obtained.

Or shall charge or encumber this contract or any payments due or which may become due to the contractor hereunder.

Or if the Bank's Engineer shall clarify in writing to the Employer that the contractor

- i) Has abandoned the contract, or
- ii) Has failed to commence the works, or has without any lawful excuse under these conditions suspended the progress of the works for fourteen days after receiving from the Employer notice to proceed or

- iii) Has failed to proceed with the works with such due diligence and failed to make such due progress as would enable the works to be completed within the time agreed upon, or
- iv) Has failed to remove materials from the site or to pull down and replace work for seven days after receiving from the Employer, written notice that the said materials or work were condemned and rejected by the Bank's Engineer under these conditions, or
- v) Has neglected or failed persistently to observe and perform all or any of the acts, matters or things by this contract to be observed and performed by the contractor for seven days after written notice shall have been given to the contractor requiring the contractor to observe or perform the same.

Then and in any of the said case the Employer may, notwithstanding any previous waiver, after giving seven days' notice in writing to the contractor, determine the contract, but without thereby affecting the powers of the Bank's Engineer or the obligations and liabilities of the contractor, the whole of which shall continue in force as fully as if the contract had not been so determined, and as if the works subsequently executed had been executed by or on behalf of the contractor. And further, the Employer by his agents or servants may enter upon and take possession of the works and all plants, tools, scaffoldings, sheds, machinery steam and other power utensils and materials lying upon the premises or the adjoining lands or roads, and use the same as his own property or may employ the same by means of his own servants and workers in carrying on and completing the works or by employing any other contractor or other person or persons to complete the works, and the contractor shall not in any way interrupt or do any act, matter or thing to prevent or hinder such other contractor or other person or persons employed for completing and finishing or using the material and plant for the works. When the works shall be completed or as soon thereafter as convenient the Bank's Engineer shall give a notice in writing to the contractor to remove his surplus materials and plant, and should the contractor fail to do so within a period of fourteen days after receipt thereof by him, the Employer may sell the same by public auction, and give credit to the contractor for the net amount realized. The Bank's Engineer shall thereafter ascertain and certify in writing under this what (if anything) shall be due or payable to or by the Employer, for the value of the said plant and materials so taken possession of by the Employer and expense or loss which the employer shall have been put to in procuring the works to be completed and the amount, if any, owing to the contractor and the amount which shall be so certified shall thereupon be paid by the Employer to the contractor or by the contractor to the Employer, as the case may be, and the Certificate of the Bank's Engineer shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

b)Termination of the Contract by the Contractor: If the payment of the amount certified by the Bank's Engineer and payable by the Employer shall be in arrears and unpaid for thirty days after notice in writing requiring payment of the amount as aforesaid shall have been given by the Contractor to the Employer, or if the Employer shall repudiate the Contractor, or if the works be stopped for three months under the order of the Employer or by any injunction or other order of any Court of Law, then and if any of

the said cases the contractor shall be at liberty to determine the Contract by notice in writing to the Employer, and he shall be entitled to recover from the Employer, payment of all works, executed and for any loss he may sustain upon any plant or materials supplied or purchase or prepared for the purpose of the Contract.

In arriving at the amount of such payment the net rates contained in Contractor's original Tender shall be followed.

28. The Employer may, in his absolute discretion, issue written instructions in regard to;
- a. The variation or modification in the design shape, quality or quantity of the items of work or the addition or omission or substitution of any item of work.
 - b. Any discrepancy in the Bill of Quantities and or specifications.
 - c. The removal from the site of any person or material brought thereon by the Contractor not to their satisfaction and the contractor shall forthwith comply with and carry out any such instructions.
29. Rates of items, if any, not mentioned in the Bills of quantities shall be fixed by the Bank's Engineer on the basis of the tendered rates to the extent possible or by rate analysis based on prevailing market rates.
30. The Contract document shall remain in the custody of Employer and shall be produced by him at his office and when required by the contractor. The contractor on signing hereof shall be furnished free of cost with a certified copy of the Agreement.
31. The contractor shall conform to the provisions of any Acts of Legislature relating to the various works and for manufacture and to the Regulations and Byelaws of an authority. The contractor shall indemnify the Employer against all claims in respect of patent rights and shall defend at his own cost all actions arising from such claims.
32. The Employer or any of his authorized representatives shall have the power to reject and/or refuse any materials of doubtful quality and workmanship.
33. **Certificates and payment:** The contractor shall be paid by the Employer on the basis of the certificates to be issued by the Bank's Engineer subject to administrative checks and corrections if any.
36. **Defective Materials:** Any defects or faults in the materials supplied and in the work done by the contractor which may appear during execution of the work or within twelve months shall, upon the discretion of the Bank's Engineer be replaced or set right by the Contractor at his own cost within seven days of receiving such directions. The Bank reserves the right to get the work executed/ work examined by other Government or Private Agency and the directions of such agency shall also be binding on the Contractor.

- 37. Measurement of works:** The Bank's Engineer may, from time to time, intimate to the contractor that he requires the works to be measured and the contractor shall forthwith attend or send a **qualified agent** to assist the Bank's Engineer in taking such measurements and calculations and to furnish all particulars and to give all assistance required. Should the contractor not attend or neglect or omit to send such agent, then the measurements taken by the Bank's Engineer or a person approved by him shall be made taken to be correct measurement of the works. Such measurements shall be taken in accordance with the Indian Standard mode of measurement, unless otherwise provided for elsewhere in this contract. The contractor or his agent may, at the time of measurement shall take such notes as he may require. All **authorized extra works**, omissions and all variations made without the knowledge, if subsequently sanctioned by him in writing shall be included in such measurements. The employer also reserves the right to verify any of the measurements of the contractor at any point of time before making the payment.
38. The contractor shall give notice of not less than ten clear days to the Bank's Engineer or his representative in charge of work before covering up or placing beyond the reach of measurement and correct dimensions thereof be taken before the same is covered up or placed beyond reach of measurement. If any work were so covered up without the consent of the Bank's Engineer and his representative in charge of the work shall be uncovered at the contractor's expense, within the aforesaid period of 10 days. In case of failure to comply with this clause the item will not be measured and paid for.
- 39. Completion Certificate:** The works shall not be considered as completed until the Bank's Engineer has certified in writing that they have been virtually completed and the defects liability period shall commence from such certified date of virtual completion of work.
40. Within 10 days of the completion of the work, the contractor shall give notice of such completion to the Bank's Engineer and within 45 days of the receipt of such notice, the Bank's Engineer shall inspect the work and if there is no defect in the work, shall furnish the contractor with a certificate of completion, otherwise a provisional certificate of completion indicating defects (a) to be rectified by the contractor and/or (b) for which payment be made at reduced rates shall be issued. But no certificate of completion, provisional or otherwise shall be issued, nor shall the work be considered to be complete until the contractor shall have removed from the premises on which the work was executed all scaffolding, surplus materials, rubbish, temporary shed been erected or constructed by the contractor(s) and cleared off the dirt from all work, doors, windows, walls, floors or other parts of any building, in, upon or about which the work was executed, or of which he may have had possession for the purpose of the execution thereof, and not until the work shall have been measured by the Bank's Engineer.
41. If the contractor fails to comply with the requirements of this clause as to removal of scaffolding, surplus materials and debris as aforesaid and cleaning off dirt on or before the

date fixed for the completion of the work, original or extended, the Employer, after issuing due notice, may at the expense of the contractor remove such scaffolding, surplus materials and debris etc. and dispose of the same as he thinks fit and clean off such dirt as aforesaid and the contractor shall have no claim in respect of any such scaffolding or surplus materials as aforesaid except for any sum actually raised by the sale thereof. And the expenses incurred on account of site clearance may be recovered from any money due, or that may become due, to the contractor by the Employer.

42. If the contractor, within 10 days after receipt of written notice from the Banks Engineer, fails to comply with such further drawings/and or Bank's Engineer Instructions the Employer may employ and pay other persons to execute any such work whatsoever that may be necessary to give effect thereto and all costs incurred in connection therewith shall be recoverable from the contractor by the Employer on the Certificate of the Bank's Engineer as a debt or may be deducted by him from any money due or to become due to the contractor.
43. The Employer shall have a right to cause at technical examination of the works and the final bill of the contractor including all supporting vouchers, abstracts etc. to be made at the time of payment of the final bill. If as a result of this examination or otherwise any sum is found to have been overpaid or over-certified it shall be lawful for the Employer to recover the sum.
44. If for any reason, the Employer is obliged, by virtue of the provisions of the Workmen Compensation Act, to pay compensation(s) to workmen employed by the Contractor, in execution of the works, the Employer will recover from the Contractor, the amount of compensation so paid, and without prejudice to the rights of the Employer under the said Act, the Employer will be at liberty to recover such amount or any part thereof by deducting it from the Security Deposit or from any sum due by the Employer to the Contractor under this Contract or otherwise. The Employer shall not be bound to contest any claim made against it under the provisions of the said Act, except on the written request of the Contractor and upon his giving to the Employer full security for all cost for which the Employer might become liable in consequence of contesting such claim.
45. **Abandonment of works:** If at any time after the acceptance of the tender the, Employer shall for any reasons whatsoever, not require the whole or any part of the works to be carried out, shall give notice in writing to the Contractor who shall have no claim to any payment of compensation or otherwise whatsoever on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the whole works.
46. Without prejudice to any of the rights of remedies under this Contract, if the Contractor dies, the Employer shall have the option of terminating the contract without compensation to the Contractor.

47. Settlement of disputes by Arbitration:

- (a) All disputes and differences of any kind whatever arising out of or in connection with the contract or the carrying out of the works (whether during the progress of the works or after their completion and whether before or after the determination abandonment or breach of the contract) shall be referred to and settled by the Bank who shall state its decision in writing. Such decision may be in the form of a final certificate or otherwise. The decision of the Bank with respect to any of the excepted matters shall be final and without appeal as stated in **preceding Clauses** hereof. But if either the Contractor be dissatisfied on any matter on which a decision is taken by the Bank as above, except any of the expected matter the Contractor may within 28 days after receiving notice of such decision give a written notice to the other party requiring that the matters in dispute be arbitrated upon. Such written notice shall specify the matters, which are in dispute or difference of which such written notice has been given. If both the parties agree a single arbitrator would be appointed for the purpose. In case no agreement could be reached on the appointment of single arbitrator, both the parties will nominate one person each as an arbitrator on their behalf. The two arbitrators nominated by the parties shall nominate one more person to act as third arbitrator or umpire.
- (b) The arbitrator or Arbitrators, as the case may be, shall have power to open up, review and revise any certificate, opinion, decision, requisition or notice, save in regard to the excepted matters, referred to in the **preceding clauses**, and to determine all matters to dispute which shall be submitted to arbitration and of which notice shall have been given as aforesaid.
The arbitrator or Arbitrators, as the case may be, shall make his or their award within one year (or such further extended time as may be decided by him or them as the case may be with the consent of the parties) from the date of entering on the reference. In case during the arbitration proceedings the parties mutually settle or compromise their dispute or difference, on the parties filing their joint memorandum of the settlement or compromise, the Arbitrator or the Arbitrators as the case may be, shall make an award in terms of such settlement or compromise.
- (c) Upon any such reference, the decision on the cost incidental to the reference and award respectively shall be in the discretion of the Arbitrator or Arbitrators as the case may be, who may determine the amount thereof or direct the same to be taxed between the party, and shall direct by whom and to whom and in what manner the same shall be borne and paid.
- (d) This submission shall be deemed to be a submission to arbitration within the meaning of the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any statutory modification thereof.
- (e) The award of the arbitrator or Arbitrators, as the case may be, shall be final and binding on the parties. It is agreed that the Contractor shall not delay the carrying out of the works by reason of any such matter, question or dispute being referred to arbitration,

but shall proceed with the works with all due diligence and shall until the decision of the arbitrator or arbitrators is given, abide by the decision of the Bank. No award of the Arbitrator or Arbitrators, as the case may be, shall relieve the Contractor of his obligations to adhere strictly to the Bank's instructions with regard to the actual carrying out of the works. The Employer and the Contractor hereby also agree that arbitration under this Clause shall be a condition precedent to any right of action under the Contract.

I/We hereby declare that I/we have read and understood the above instructions to the contractors.

Place:

Section C

Special Condition of the contract

1. The contractor shall abide all the Contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act 1970 and its subsequent amendments.
2. The workmen will not be allowed to stay within the premises beyond working hours.
3. No storage space will be provided by the Bank. Contractors have to make necessary temporary arrangements for the same. However, they may be permitted to make temporary sheds at approved locations within the premises during the period of work. The same shall be removed and taken away by the contractor at their risk and cost after completion of the work.
4. The water required for the work or workmen can be availed from the available source at site free of cost. However, if there is shortage of water, contractors have to make their own arrangements for the same at their risk and cost. The Contractor has to make his own arrangements to take the supply to the requisite position/location.
5. The electric power required for the work can also be similarly drawn from the supply available at site free of cost. The Contractor has to make his own arrangements to take the supply to the requisite position in consultation with Bank's Engineers.
6. Permission, if any, required from the local bodies shall be obtained by the Contractor at his cost.
7. The authorized officials of the Bank shall be entitled to inspect the material/works at any time, if they so desire and the vendor shall provide all reasonable facilities to do so.
8. The contractor shall employ authorised and qualified site Engineer on a regular basis to supervise day-today works at site. Such a person shall be capable of following the instructions of the Bank's Engineers and execute the works as per the specifications laid down in the Tender. He shall also maintain daily labour report, daily material consumption, etc. and shall submit the same to the Department
9. The intending Bidder can obtain any clarifications regarding the tender provisions/specifications etc. if any from the office of the Principal, College of Agricultural Banking, Reserve Bank of India, University Road, Pune- 411016 on any Bank's working day.
10. The Bidder may please note that the work is to be executed in an occupied residential colony of the Bank and as such the entire work involved shall be carried out with least disturbance to the residents.
11. The entire materials for the work shall be brought to the working area through the staircase only without any disturbance to the residents.
12. The debris/dust or any wastage generated out of the above work shall be cleaned as frequently as required and as instructed by the Bank's Engineer and make the entire premises clear/clean on a day to day basis including staircase, passages affected/used by the labourers in the above work to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineers at no extra cost. The entire debris/waste material shall be taken out of the Bank's premises and should not be dumped anywhere in and around the Bank's premises. The contractors are solely responsible if any debris is noticed by the local Corporation and penalty levied.

13. The Bidder is advised to inspect the proposed site of work to acquaint them of the scope of work.
14. The work has to be done in proper coordination with the Caretaker of the colony and other contractors engaged by the Bank.
15. The rates shall be exclusive of GST. **GST should be added separately taking into consideration the amount which the service provider needs to pay to the Govt. of India for providing the services to the Service Recipient in the BOQ.** Refer to the notifications issued by the Govt. of India in this regard from time to time.
16. If, in the price structure quoted by a bidder, there is discrepancy between the unit price and the total price (which is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity), the unit price shall prevail and the total price corrected accordingly, unless the Bank feels that the bidder has made a mistake in placing the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the total price as quoted shall prevail over the unit price and the unit price corrected accordingly.
17. If there is an error in a total price, which has been worked out through addition and / or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total corrected; and
18. If there is a discrepancy between the amount expressed in words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, subject to 19 and 20 below.
19. In case for any item rate is not filled / found blank, the Bank shall take highest quoted rates among the Bidders for evaluation for such item rates. However, lowest quoted rate shall be payable to Bidder for such item, in case the Bidder is declared as lowest Bidder.
20. If there is any arithmetical error in totaling of individual items, the correct total shall be computed by the Bank and the same shall prevail.
21. **Non-disclosure:** The Firm shall not disclose directly or indirectly any information, materials and details of the Bank's infrastructure / systems/ equipment etc., which may come to the possession or knowledge of the Firm during the course of discharging contractual obligations in connection with this agreement, to any third party and shall at all times hold the same in strictest confidence. The Firm shall treat the details of the contract as private and confidential, except to the extent necessary to carry out the obligations under the contract or to comply with applicable laws. The Firm shall not publish, permit to be published, or disclose any particulars of the works in any trade or technical paper or elsewhere without the previous written consent of the Bank. The Firm shall indemnify the Bank for any loss suffered by it as a result of disclosure of any confidential information. Failure to observe the above shall be treated as breach of contract on the part of the Firm and the Bank shall be entitled to claim damages and pursue legal remedies. The Firm shall take all appropriate actions with respect to its employees to ensure that the obligations of non-disclosure of confidential information under this agreement are fully satisfied. The Firm's obligations with respect to non-

disclosure and confidentiality will survive the expiry or termination of this agreement for whatever reason.

22. **Force Majeure:** The Bidder shall not be liable for forfeiture of its EMD, liquidated damages or termination for default, if the delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the contract is a result of an event of Force Majeure. For purposes of the clause, "Force Majeure" means an event beyond the control of the Bidder and not involving the Bidder's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes etc. The Bank will decide whether delay or failure on the part of the Bidder was the result of an event beyond his control or not. The decision of the Bank in this regard should be final and binding on the supplier and will not be open to question before any court / forum in any proceedings.

23. **Termination of contract.**

The Bank shall terminate the contract by giving seven days' notice if

- i. The bidder fails to deliver any or all items of work as specified in the tender document within the time period specified in the contract. or
- ii. If the bidder fails to perform any other obligations under the contract.

24. On termination of contract, the Earnest Money Deposit (EMD)/ Retention Money Deposit (RMD) of the bidder will be forfeited.

25. Termination for Insolvency: The Bank may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to bidder, without compensation to bidder, if the Bidder becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which the Bank is or will be entitled to take or seek.

26. **Clause of Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Work place:**

- a) The firm shall be solely responsible in case of any complaint of sexual harassment against its employee within the premises of the Bank, the complaint will be filed before the Regional Committee constituted by the Reserve Bank of India and Bank shall ensure appropriate action under the said Act in respect of the complaint.
- b) Any complaint of sexual harassment from any aggrieved employee of the firm against any employee of the Bank shall be taken cognizance of by the Regional Complaint Committee constituted by the Bank.
- c) The firm shall be responsible for any monetary compensation that may need to be paid in case the incident involves the employees of the firm, for instance any monetary relief to Bank's employees, if sexual violence by the employee of the firm is proved.
- d) The firm shall be responsible for educating its employees about prevention of sexual harassment at work place and related issues.

e) The firm shall provide a complete and updated list of its employees who are deployed within the Bank's premises.

I/We hereby declare that I/We have read and understood all the above instructions/conditions and the same will remain binding upon me/us in case the above mentioned Contract is entrusted to me/us. I/we also note that this letter will form part of the contract document and that the contents of this letter shall be supplemental to the conditions in the tender and not in derogation thereof except to the extent specifically provided herein.

SAFETY CODE

1. First aid appliances including adequate supply of sterilized dressing and cotton wool shall be kept in a readily accessible place.
2. An injured person shall be taken to a public hospital without loss of time, in cases where the injury necessitates hospitalization.
3. Suitable and strong scaffolds should be provided for workmen for all works that cannot safely be done from the ground/floor.
4. No portable single ladder shall be over 8m in length. The width between the side rails shall not be less than 30cm (clear) and the distance between two adjacent rungs shall not be more than 30cm. When a ladder is used, an extra mazdoor shall be engaged for holding ladder.
5. The excavated material shall not be placed within 1.5m of the edge of the trench or half of the depth of trench whichever is more. All trenches and excavations shall be provided with necessary fencing and lighting.
6. Every opening in the floor of a building or in a working platform shall be provided with suitable means to prevent the fall of persons or materials by providing suitable fencing or railing whose minimum height shall be one metre.
7. No floor, roof or other part of the structure shall be so overloaded with debris or materials as to render it unsafe.
8. Workers employed on mixing and handling materials such as asphalt, cement mortar or concrete and lime mortar shall be provided with protective footwear and rubber hand-gloves.
9. Those engaged in welding works shall be provided with welder's protective eye shields and gloves.
10. No paint containing lead or lead products shall be used except in the form of paste or readymade paint.
11. Suitable facemasks should be supplied for use by the workers when the paint is applied in the form of spray or surface having lead paint dry rubbed or scrapped.
12. Overalls shall be supplied by the Contractor to the painters and adequate facilities shall be provided to enable the working painters to wash during the periods of cessation of work.
13. Hoisting machines and tackle used in the works, including their attachments, anchorage and supports shall be in perfect condition.
14. The ropes used in hoisting or lowering material or as a means of suspension shall be of durable quality and adequate strength and free from defects.

Section D

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS OF WORK

The scope of work covers '**CONVERSION OF COURTYARD INTO OPEN TEA ROOM**' in accordance with specifications prepared to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer. The following specifications shall form part of the contract and these shall have deemed to be supplemental to the specifications and not in derogation thereof except to the extent specifically provided herein.

PARTICULAR SPECIFICATIONS FOR TUBULAR STRUCTURE FOR FRAMEWORK, ETC.

1. GENERAL:

Supply, Providing, Fabricating, Assembling and erecting at site Tubular Structure (All Columns, base plates, roof portals, purlins, Facade frame work, canopy steel structure etc., or similar work) consisting of MS base plates (YST 250) MS Pipes, squares rectangles, & other structural steel sections conforming to IS 1161 Grade 310.

1.1. SCOPE OF WORK:

The above item includes supplying, providing, fabricating, assembling, and erecting at site Tubular structure in the profile/shape as per the drawing with special plate connectors, pinion joints, using SAW / MIG / MMAW welding process with cleaning the surface with copper slag blasting, Powder coating MS structure with approved shade (with dry film thickness not less than 45 micron).

1.2. MATERIALS:

MS Plates confirming to IS 2062 YST 250 Gr. and Tubular Hollow Section Conforming to IS 1161/4923, Yst-310.

Connecting Bolts to be hot dipped galvanized high tensile bolts of minimum 10.9 grade. The Bolts should be as per IS 1364/IS 1367. Bolts shall be provided with a washer of sufficient thickness to avoid any threaded portion falling within the thickness of the parts bolted together if required.

The bended rafter/purlins in the profile as per drawing should be connected to the profiles MS rakers with suitable arrangement; Metal casing shall be provided at the end of rakers as per the drawings. The bending of the members wherever specified should be in exact profile as per requirement.

Connector should be of high strength, manufactured out of similar grade of steel material of required dimensions and holes for the bolts in the required position and direction. The item includes cleaning the surface and painting two coats of epoxy primer cum intermediate and two of more coats of polyurethane paint etc. complete. The structure should be properly bended, connected welded and aligned to get the required profile.

1.3 EXECUTION

Tubular frame work (Pattern as per approved design and drawings) shall be got executed by specialized agencies having requisite experience in execution of similar works of similar magnitude as approved by Bank's Engineer. Structural Steel work shall be executed as per Structural design duly vetted by IIT/NIT/reputed Govt. Engineering College. As payment of Structural design and vetting fee shall be the responsibility of the executing agency necessary consideration of the same should be made while submission of the tender.

The structure should be properly bended, connected, welded and aligned to the required profile, i.e. work shall be executed as per designs given and workshop drawing prepared by the agency and got approved by the Bank's Engineer.

Tubular structure system with plate connectors, pinion joints, etc. complete in all respects to make structure of main Terminal Building/canopy is to be provided.

All components of tubular frame to be cleared off the dusts/scales etc. completely before applying primer.

1.4 FABRICATION PROCEDURE

1.4.1 Assembly

All connections shall be either bolted or welded as shown on the drawings. The contractor shall not redesign or alter any connection without prior approval of the Bank's Engineer. The components parts shall be assembled in such a manner that they are neither twisted nor otherwise damaged and shall be prepared such that the specified cambers, if any, are provided. Drifting done during assembly shall not distort the metal or enlarge the holes.

1.4.2 Bolting

a) All steel work, which is bolted together, shall be in close contact over the whole surface. Where two bolted surfaces are to be in permanent contact after assembly, each shall be thoroughly scraped free of loose scales, dirt and burs and a heavy coat of red oxide, zinc phosphate or other approved paint applied after cleaning and drying.

All bolts shall be providing with washers under the nuts and the washers shall be tapered on the inside of the flanges of RS joists and channels. Bolts and studs shall project not less than one full thread through the nut after tightening. Unless otherwise specified, the ends of the bolts shall be burred after erections of prevent the removal of nuts.

b) High tensile steel bolts of grade 10.9 shall be used in bearing of friction as shown on the drawings. High strength bolted joints shall be made without the use of erection bolts. Bolts shall be of a length that will extend not less than 10mm beyond the nuts. Bolts shall be entered into the holes without damaging the thread-members. They shall be brought tightly together with sufficient high-strength fitting up bolts, which shall be re-tightened as all the bolts are finally tightened. Bolt heads shall be protected from damage during placing. Bolts that have been completely tightened hall be marked for identification. Bolted

parts shall fit solidly together and shall not be separated by interposed compressible materials. The contact surface in high strength bolted connections shall be free of oil, paint, lacquer, loose scale or other coatings. The facing surfaces shall be machined flat. Final tightening of high strength bolts shall be by turn of nut method.

c) Anchor bolts shall be set by use of templates secured firmly in place to permit true positioning of the bearing plates and assemblies. When in drawings anchor bolts are shown to be installed in sleeves, the sleeves shall be completely filled with grout.

1.4.3 Welding

a) Welding shall be done in accordance with IS-816-code of practice for use of metal arc welding for general construction in mild steel.

b) IS: 820 - Code of Practice for the use of welding in tubular construction.

Shearing, chipping or gas cutting may prepare profile of fusion faces. In all cases the faces should be dressed by chipping, filling or grinding and made regular.

The surface to be welded and adjoining metal for distance of at least 20mm must be clean free of rust, scale, paint etc.

Each bead of metal shall have the slag removed by light hammering and wire brushing before the next bead is deposited. The weld must show a good clean contour and on a cut specimen good fusion with parent metal. Before applying paint, the weld shall be carefully chipped and wire brushed.

Welding procedure shall be based on the specific analysis of any given heat of steel and shall be subject to the review of the Bank's Engineer.

These procedures shall call for one or all the following:

Proper bead shape:

Minimized penetration to prevent dilution of the weld metal with the alloy elements
Preheating, controlled inter-pass temperature and controlled heat input.

Welding shall be performed only by qualified and tested welders specifically trained and experienced for the type of job required to execute the welding work to the complete satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer. Welder should have minimum five years of experience in the job of similar nature.

Use of standard weld symbols as adopted by IS: 813 is mandatory. Pre-qualified joints which are detailed, prepared and welded in accordance with the requirement of IS: 816 shall invariably be used.

Structural welding shall not commence until joints elements are bolted or tacked in intimate contact and adjusted to dimensions shown with allowance for any weld shrinkage that is expected. Welding sequence shall be planned and controlled to minimize undue stress increase or undue distortions on restrained members. Heavy sections and those having a high degree of restraint shall be welded with low hydrogen type electrodes.

Concave bead shape shall be avoided. Radius of weld width to weld depth shall preferably vary from a minimum of 1 to 1 to a maximum 1.4 to 1.

Width of weld / Depth of fusion = 1 to 1.4

Field Welding shall not be permitted unless shown on the drawings.

Subsequent to fabrication, the overlapping or contracting surfaces or other closed sections (such as tubular, box section) which are inaccessible to painting shall be seal welded when the end of the tube is not automatically sealed of its connection by welding to another member the end shall be properly and completely sealed. Before sealing, the inside of the tube shall be made dry and free from loose scale.

Order of assembly of the tubular section shall consist of welding the tensile member to the main member first. Compression member shall be cut back to overlap the tensile member and then welded to both the tensile members.

1.4.4 Inspection of Welding:

All welded connection shall be inspected as per IS: 822.

1.5 ERECTION

As far as possible, the contractor shall deliver the fabricated steel work to the site in the same sequence as that which he wishes to follow for the erection. Dispatch should be scheduled to avoid cluttering up of the site. The bolts required for erection shall be bagged according to size prior to dispatch. The sequence & methodology of erection shall be prepared & submitted by the agency before starting the erection work.

All structural work shall be erected in accordance with IS: 800, IS: 806 and IS: 1915 and as per the approved erection drawings. The contractor shall be responsible for setting out the works. The suitability and capacity of all plant and equipment used for erection shall be to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer. These shall be regularly serviced and maintained. Occupation safety practices shall be strictly adhered to and shall be to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer.

Individual places shall be plumbed, leveled and aligned. Drifting shall be used only to bring together the several arts. They shall not be used in such manner as to distort or damage the metal. Temporary bracing, but-line and staging shall be provided to ensure proper alignment and to adequately protect all persons, property and to withstand all loading to which the structure may be subjected during erection.

Attachment of such temporary steel work to the permanent steel work shall only be done with the approval of the Bank's Engineer. Temporary steel work shall remain in position until the structure is stable and self-supporting and permanently bolted or welded to the satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer after removal of temporary steel work, the permanent structure shall be made good to the complete satisfaction of the Bank's Engineer.

No permanent bolting or welding shall be done until proper alignment has been obtained. Erection of the parts with any moderate amount of reaming, chipping or cutting shall be

immediately reported to the Bank's Engineer. The steel work shall be rejected unless corrective action is approved by the Bank's Engineer.

Placement of joists shall not start until the supporting work is secured. Temporary bridging, connections and anchors shall be proved to assure lateral stability during erection. Bridging to steel joists shall be installed immediately after joint erection, before any construction loads are applied. Horizontal or vertical bridging shall be provided in accordance with the type of span of the joists. Ends of the bridging lines shall be anchored at top and bottom chords where terminating to walls or beams.

1.6.1 Surface Preparation & Comments

Abrasive blast cleans to Sa2.5 (ISO 8501-1:1988) or SSPC-SP6. If oxidation has occurred between blasting and application, the surface should be re-blasted to the specified visual standard. Surface defects revealed by the process, should be ground, filled, or treated in the appropriate manner. All surfaces to be coated should be clean, dry and free from contamination. Prior to paint application all surfaces should be assessed and treated in accordance with ISO 8504:1992. Oil or grease should be removed in accordance with SSPCSP1 solvent cleaning.

1.7 TEST & FREQUENCIES

1.7.1 Material Test:

All the material shall be tested as per relevant specification mentioned there-in, all pipes/plates/sections shall be tested as per following frequency for physical and chemical properties.

- a) Pipes — Hollow Section: -one test per dia. / size subject to minimum one test per 9 MT per size. However, if quantity of any size is less than 1 MT, the test may be waived of at the discretion of EIC.
- b) Plates/Flats: -One test per 20MT for each size
- c) Manufacturers test certificate shall also be supplied along with each batch material.

2. PARTICULAR SPECIFICATIONS FOR PRE STRESSED TENSILE MEMBRANE FABRIC FOR ROOFING

2.1 Material

All the membrane materials specified for the roof should be manufactured in country of Fabric company's origin. A declaration from the manufacturer along with certificate of origin has to be provided by the fabric supplier. The material in general shall conform to following parameters:

1. Flame retardant as per manufacturer's specification and shall conform to relevant European/ ASTM/ Indian standards.
2. The membrane must have a double lacquering made out of highly concentrated PVDF on both side, double side primer, double PVC coating. Calibrated PVDF Alloys not allowed.
3. The membrane shall be highly flexible and not suffering any peeling of the top coat (lacquering) effect.
4. The foldability / flexibility of the material shall confirm to relevant European/ ASTM for crack resistance.
5. The colour of the fabric shall be Gray or While as approved by the department. Sample of the proposed fabric has to be submitted for approval and approval is to be obtained before procurement.

2.2 Warranty

The Canopy installed shall be in accordance with this specification and shall be guaranteed against water proofing/leakage for 10 years. After execution Fabric warranty shall be given for the years as per minimum year or fabric brand's specified years whichever is higher.

2.3 STRUCTURAL CABLES AND FITTINGS

a) This work shall consist of the fabrication and supply of all the structural cables and fittings for the support of the tensioned membrane structures as shown in the drawings.

b) All edge cables to be Galvanised Strands (Grade I 570MPa strand) with stainless end terminations. All tensioners, nuts and bolt shall be stainless steel and manufactured to the relevant standards.

All membrane plates shall be proprietary design manufactured to IS standards. All membrane plates shall be hot dip galvanised and treated with a two-coat epoxy paint finishing system applied by an accredited painting contractor.

c) Joints in Cables

No splicing or joining of wires, strands or ropes shall be permitted. Wire rope shall be packaged in coils or reels at the discretion of the manufacturer, and handled throughout in such a manner as to avoid permanent deformation of wire, rope or strand.

d) Swaged Terminals

All terminations shall be stainless steel. The materials, thickness and swaging system employed shall be chosen by the specialist sub-contractor to achieve a breaking strength of the terminal detail not lower than the specified minimum breaking strength of the cable.

e) Shackles, Rigging Screws and Turnbuckles

All fittings shall be hot dipped galvanized. The strength of the shackles, rigging screws and turnbuckles etc. shall exceed the minimum breaking load (MBL) specified on the drawings. The shackles, rigging screws and turnbuckles etc. shall meet the tensioning and tolerance requirement for the fitting used in tensioned membrane structure.

2.4 Testing

Tensile fabric material shall confirm to specifications as specified above and shall be tested for its Tensile Strength, Tear Strength, and weight per SqM. in accordance with relevant Indian/ European/ American Standards or as specified by the manufacturer. All testing results should be in confirmation with the specification desired and approved by Bank's Engineer.

3. CONCRETE AND ALLIED WORKS

It shall be very clearly understood that the specifications given herein are brief and do not cover minute details. However, all works shall have to be carried out in accordance with the relevant standards and codes of practices or in their absence in accordance with the best accepted current Engineering practices or as directed by BANK'S ENGINEER from time to time. The decision of BANK'S ENGINEER as regards the specification to be adopted and their interpretation and the mode of execution of work shall be final and binding on CONTRACTOR and no claim whatsoever will be entertained on this account.

3.2 GENERAL

3.2.1 BANK'S ENGINEER shall have the right at all times to inspect all operations including the sources of materials, procurement, layout and storage of materials, the concrete batching and mixing equipment, and the quality control system. Such an inspection shall be arranged, and Bank's Engineer approval obtained, prior to starting of concrete work. This shall, however, not relieve CONTRACTOR of any of his responsibilities. All materials, which do not conform to this specification, shall be rejected.

3.2.2 Materials should be selected so that they can satisfy the design requirements of strength, serviceability, safety, durability and finish with due regards to the functional requirements and the environmental conditions to which the structure will be subjected. Materials complying with codes/standards shall only be used.

3.3 MATERIALS

3.3.1 Cement

- (a) Unless otherwise specified or called for by BANK'S ENGINEER, cement shall be ordinary Portland cement conforming to IS: 269, IS: 8112 or IS: 12269.
- (b) If used, The Portland pozzolana cement shall conform to IS: 1489 and it shall be used as directed by BANK'S ENGINEER. Where Portland pozzolana cements are used, it shall be ensured that consistency of quality is maintained and there will be no adverse interactions between the materials and the finish specified is not marred.
- (c) Only one type of cement shall be used in any one mix unless specifically approved by BANK'S ENGINEER.
- (d) Cement, which is not used within 90 days from its date of manufacture, shall be tested at a laboratory approved by BANK'S ENGINEER and until the results of such tests are found satisfactory, it shall not be used in any work.

3.3.2 Aggregates

- (a) Aggregates shall consist of naturally occurring stones and gravel (crushed or uncrushed) and manufactured sand (M sand) from approved source. They shall be chemically inert, strong, hard, clean, durable against weathering, of limited porosity, free from dust/silt/organic impurities/deleterious materials and conform to IS: 383. Aggregates such as slag, crushed over burnt bricks, bloated clay ash, sintered fly ash and tiles shall not be used.
- (b) Aggregates containing reactive materials shall be used only after tests conclusively prove that there will be no adverse effect on strength, durability and finish, including long term effects, on the concrete.
- (c) The fineness modulus of manufactured sand (M sand) shall be neither less than 2.2 nor more than 3.2. The CONTRACTOR shall be allowed to use river sand with the prior approval of BANK'S ENGINEER, if the manufactured sand is not available / shortage.
- (d) The maximum size of coarse aggregate shall not be greater than 1/4 of the minimum thickness of the member, if the concrete can be placed without difficulty to surround all reinforcement thoroughly and fill the corners of the form. For most of work 20mm downgraded aggregate is suitable.
- (e) In concrete elements with thin sections, closely spaced reinforcements or small cover, consideration should be given to the use of 10mm nominal maximum size.
- (f) Plums 150 mm and above of a reasonable size may be used where directed. Plums shall not constitute more than 40% by volume of concrete unless specified by Bank's Engineer.

3.3.3 Water

- a) Water used for both mixing and curing shall conform to IS: 456. Potable water is generally satisfactory. Water containing any excess of acid, alkali, sugar or salt shall not be used.
- b) The pH value of water shall not be less than 6.
- c) Seawater shall not be used for concrete mixing and curing.
- d) The proposed admixtures shall comply with requirements of Specification for admixture.

3.3.4 Reinforcement

- a) Reinforcement bars shall conform to IS: 1786 and welded wire fabric to IS: 1566 as shown on the drawing.
- b) All reinforcement shall be clean, free from pitting, oil, grease, paint, loose mill scales, rust, dirt, dust or any other substance that will destroy or reduce bond.
- c) The reinforcing bars to be provided with Fusion Bonded Epoxy coating shall conform to the and relevant I.S. specifications specified in the subsequent para with the prior approval of BANK'S ENGINEER .

3.3.5 Samples and Tests

- a) All major materials used for the works shall be tested before use as per relevant IS standards. Decision of BANK'S ENGINEER on testing of such materials is final and binding.
- b) Sampling and testing of aggregates shall be as per IS: 2386 under the supervision of BANK'S ENGINEER . The cost of all tests, sampling, etc. shall be borne by CONTRACTOR. For coarse aggregate crushing value shall be tested.
- c) Water to be used shall be tested to comply with Clause 5.4 of IS: 456.
- d) CONTRACTOR shall furnish manufacturer's test certificates and technical literature for the admixture proposed to be used. If directed, the admixture shall be got tested at an approved laboratory at no extra cost.

3.3.6 Storing of Materials

- a) All material shall be stored in a manner to prevent its deterioration and contamination, which would preclude its use in the works. Requirements of IS: 4082 shall be complied with
- b) CONTRACTOR will have to make his own arrangements for the storage of adequate quantity of cement. If such cement is not stored properly and has deteriorated, the material shall be rejected. Cement bags shall be stored in dry weatherproof shed with a raised floor, well away from the outer walls and insulated from the floor to avoid moisture from ground. Not more than 15 bags shall be stacked in any tier. BANK'S ENGINEER shall approve storage arrangement. Storage under tarpaulins shall not be permitted. Each consignment of cement shall be stored separately and consumed in its order of

receipt. CONTRACTOR shall maintain record of receipt, consumption and current stock of cement.

- c) Each size of coarse and fine aggregates shall be stacked separately and shall be protected from dropping leaves and contamination with foreign material. The stacks shall be on hard, clean, free draining bases, draining away from the concrete mixing area.
- d) CONTRACTOR shall make his own arrangements for storing water at site in tanks of approved capacity. The tanks shall be cleaned at least once a week to prevent contamination.
- e) The reinforcement shall be stacked on top of timber sleepers to avoid contact with ground/ water. Each type and size shall be stacked separately.

3.4 CONCRETE

3.4.1 General

Concrete grade shall be as designated on drawings. Concrete in the works shall be "DESIGN MIX CONCRETE". All concrete works of up to grade M15 can be NOMINAL MIX CONCRETE whereas all other grades, M20 and above, shall be DESIGN MIX CONCRETE

3.4.2 Design Mix Concrete

- a) Design Mix Concrete are classified in three categories, viz. "Normal Concrete (M)", "Heavy Concrete (H)", "Super Heavy Concrete (SH)". A prefix and two numbers shall identify each class of concrete. Prefix "M" would denote Normal Concrete, prefix "H" would denote heavy concrete and prefix "SH" would denote super heavy concrete. The Number would denote the crushing strength of cube at 28 days in N/sq.mm
- b) Normal concrete shall have a net dry unit weight of not less than 25 KN/cum, for the finished structure after curing. Heavy concrete shall have a net dry unit weight of not less than 36.30 KN/cum, for the finished structure after curing. Special heavy concrete shall have a net dry unit weight of not less than 41 KN/cum for the finished structure after curing.
- c) Mix Design & Testing: For Design Mix Concrete, the mix shall be designed as per any of four methods given in SP: 23 to provide the grade of concrete having the required workability and characteristic strength not less than appropriate values given in IS: 456. The design mix shall in addition be such that it is cohesive and does not segregate during placement and should result in a dense and durable concrete capable of giving the specified finish. For liquid retaining structures, the mix shall also result in watertight concrete. The CONTRACTOR shall exercise great care while designing the concrete mix and executing the works to achieve the desired result.
- d) The minimum grade of concrete shall be as per Table 5 of IS: 456 for various exposure conditions of concrete. For various environmental conditions, refer Table 3 of IS: 456.
- e) The minimum cement content for Design Mix Concrete shall be as per Table 5 of IS:

456 or as given below, whichever is higher.

Grade of Concrete, M	Minimum Cement content in kg/cum. of concrete
20	300
25	320
30	340
35	360
40	360
45	400

f) *The minimum cement content stipulated above shall be adopted irrespective of whether the CONTRACTOR achieves the desired strength with less quantity of cement. The CONTRACTOR's quoted rates for concrete shall provide for the above eventuality and nothing extra shall become payable to the CONTRACTOR on this account. Even in the case where the quantity of cement required is higher than that specified above to achieve desired strength based on an approved mix design, nothing extra shall become payable to the CONTRACTOR.*

g) It shall be CONTRACTOR's sole responsibility to carry out the mix designs at his own cost. He shall furnish to BANK'S ENGINEER for approval at least 30 days before concreting operations, a statement of proportions proposed to be used for the various concrete mixes and the strength results obtained. The strength requirements of the concrete mixes ascertained on 150 mm cubes as per IS: 516 shall comply with the requirements of IS: 456.

- j) Where single size graded coarse aggregate are not available, aggregates of different sizes shall be properly combined. The CONTRACTOR's mix design shall show that combined grading of coarse aggregate meets the requirements of Table 2 of IS: 383 for graded aggregates.
- k) Design mix adopted shall be got checked by the approved proof checking consultant, appointed by the Employer.

3.4.3 Batching & Mixing of Concrete

- a) Proportions of aggregates and cement, as per approved concrete mix design, shall be by weight. These proportions shall be maintained during subsequent concrete batching by means of weigh batchers capable of controlling the weights within $\pm 2\%$ for cement and $\pm 3\%$ for aggregate. The batching equipment shall be calibrated at the frequency decided by BANK'S ENGINEER.
- b) Amount of water added shall be such as to produce dense concrete of required consistency, specified strength and satisfactory workability and shall be so adjusted to account for moisture content in the aggregates. Water- cement ratio specified for use by ENGINEER-IN-CHARGE shall be maintained. Each time the work stops, the mixer shall be cleaned out, and while recommencing, the first batch shall have 10% additional sand and cement to allow for sticking in the drum.
- c) Arrangement should be made by the CONTRACTOR to have the cubes tested at his own expense in an approved laboratory or in field with prior consent of BANK'S ENGINEER. Sampling and testing of strength and workability of concrete shall be as per IS: 1199, IS: 516 and IS: 456. It is preferable to cast additional cubes (minimum 3 specimen) for testing

at 7 days and 28 days. Concrete cube compressive strength which shall be reported & carried out as per relevant IS code e.g. IS 456:2000 etc. in addition to following parameters:

- (i) Ultrasonic Pulse Velocity Measurements on Cubes (2 measurements from opposite faces where load is not to be applied) before evaluating the 28-day Compressive Strength of Cubes – 5 Samples
- (ii) 28-day Compressive Strength of Cylinders: As per IS: 516 – 1959 (Reaffirmed 2004) – 5 Samples
- (iii) Modulus of Elasticity: As per IS: 516 – 1959 (Reaffirmed 2004) – 5 Samples.
- (iv) Tensile Strength: As per IS: 5816 – 1999 (Reaffirmed 2004) – 5 Samples
- (v) Hydraulic Permeability: As per IS: 3085 – 1965 (Reaffirmed 2002) – 5 Samples

3.5 NOMINAL MIX CONCRETE

3.5.1 Mix Design & Testing

Mix Design and preliminary tests are not necessary for Nominal Mix Concrete. However works tests shall be carried out as per IS: 456. Proportions for Nominal Mix Concrete and w/c ratio may be adopted as per Table 9 of IS: 456. However, it will be CONTRACTOR's sole responsibility to adopt appropriate nominal mix proportions to achieve the specified characteristic strength.

3.5.2 Batching & Mixing of Concrete

Based on the adopted nominal mixes, aggregates shall be measured by volume. However, cement shall be by weight only. Appropriate correction shall be made for bulking of sand after testing.

3.6 QUALITY CONTROL

3.6.1 BANK'S ENGINEER may furnish quality control formats for concrete works after award of work. CONTRACTOR shall note that it is required to adopt all such formats

3.6.2 Alternatively, if CONTRACTOR has his own QC formats he may adopt them subjected to such modifications considered necessary and approval by BANK'S ENGINEER.

3.6.3 In either case CONTRACTOR shall submit his detailed Quality Assurance Plan after the award of contract. This would be reviewed, appropriately modified and approved by BANK'S ENGINEER.

3.7 INSPECTION

All materials, workmanship and finished construction shall be subject to continuous inspection and approval of BANK'S ENGINEER. Materials rejected by BANK'S ENGINEER shall be expressly removed from site within 3 (three) working days and shall be replaced by CONTRACTOR immediately at no extra cost to OWNER.

3.8 **CLEAN-UP**

Upon the completion of concrete work, all forms, equipment, construction tools, protective coverings and any debris, scraps of wood, etc. resulting from the work shall be removed and the premises left clean.

AND WHEREAS the Contractor has agreed to execute, subject to the conditions set forth
herein and in the correspondence attached hereto and to the Conditions set forth in the
Special Conditions and in the Schedule of Quantities and Conditions of Contract (all of
which are collectively herein after referred to as "the said Conditions") the works described
in the said Specifications and included in the said Schedule of Quantities at the respective
rates therein set forth amounting to the sum as therein arrived or such other sum as shall
become payable there under (herein after referred to as "the said Contract Amount").

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. In consideration herein mentioned the Contractor will, subject to the conditions annexed
carry out and complete the work shown in the Contract, Drawing and described by or
referred to in the Schedule of Quantities and in the said conditions.
2. The Bank shall pay the Contractor the said Contract Amount, or such other sum as shall
become payable, at the times and in the same manner specified in the said Conditions.

respectively abide by, submit themselves to the said conditions and the correspondence
